Training Sponsored by Chesapeake Child Care Resource Center

In a continuing effort to meet the goal of quality, developmentally appropriate child care, every training conducted through Chesapeake Child Care Resource Center will include discussion about inclusive care and focus on meeting the needs of individual children served in early care settings.

CHILD CARE I: GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT

This course is designed to cover the growth and development of children from birth to six years of age. Topics include social, emotional, physical, and intellectual development. NOTE: Students must take Child Care I - CEU 812, and Child Care II - CEU 813 to meet the 90-hour child care certification requirements. Core of Knowledge: COMBO - Beginning. Perfect attendance required. Class limit: 20 students. **Tuition: In-county \$30, Out-of-county \$35, Out-of-State \$40. All students pay \$140 course fee. (T)**

CHILD CARE II: ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

This course introduces the principles, materials, and methods used with young children from birth to thirteen years of age to involve them in safe and educational activities. Students must complete Child Care I: Growth and Development prior to attending this course. NOTE: Students must take Child Care I - CEU 812, and Child Care II - CEU 813 to meet the 90-hour pre-service child care certification requirements. Core of Knowledge - COMBO Beginning. Perfect attendance required. Class limit: 20 students. **Tuition: In-county \$30, Out-of-county \$35, Out-of-State \$40. All students pay \$140 course fee.**

SCHOOL-AGE CHILD CARE

In this course, students will explore the growth and development of children and adolescents and its application to the development and the implementation of age-appropriate activities. The course meets the 45-hour pre-service education requirement set by the Office of Child Care for the certification of school-age child care group leaders. Core of Knowledge: COMBO - Beginning. Perfect attendance required. Class limit: 20 students. **Tuition: In-county \$30, Out-of-county \$35, Out-of-State \$40. All students pay \$140 course fee. (T)**

CHILD CARE CENTER MANAGEMENT

This course is a study of management practices and the administrative function of Child Care Center directors. Topics include: Licensing regulations, facility operation and management; budget and book-keeping; selection and evaluation for staff; communications; planning and inventory of equipment and supplies. Core of Knowledge: COMBO - Intermediate. Perfect attendance required. Class limit: 20 students. **Tuition: In-county \$30, Out-of-county \$35, Out-of-State \$40. All students pay \$140 course fee. (T)**

INFANT DEVELOPMENT AND CARE

This course is designed to be an introduction to the field of infant child care. Students will focus on the growth and development of a child from conception through age three. This course meets the 45-hour pre-service education requirement set by the Office of Child Care for infant certification. Core of Knowledge: COMBO - Beginning. Perfect attendance required. **Class limit: 20 students. Tuition: In-county \$30,**

Topics include the milestones of growth and development, basic beliefs of leading child theorists, and insights into learning differences among children. Core of Knowledge: Child Development - Beginning. Class limit: 20 students. **Tuition: In-county \$5, Out-of-county \$10, Out-of-State \$15. All students pay \$20 course fee.**

PROFESSIONALISM

Topics include supervision and appropriate guidance, recognizing and reporting abuse or neglect, basic record keeping, developing policies and procedures, as well as tips for creating handbooks and contracts. Core of Knowledge: Professionalism - Beginning. Class limit: 20 students. **Tuition: In-county \$5, Out-of-county \$10, Out-of-State \$15. All students pay \$20 course fee.**

**EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS FOR
CHILD CARE PROVIDERS**

This training is designed for child care center staff, family child care providers, and informal providers. Successful completion requires completion of a written emergency plan for center room, program, family child care program or informal program. This training will build upon basic child care licensing requirements and address additional areas of concern that are now in the forefront of emergency preparedness planning. Core of Knowledge: Health, Safety, and Nutrition - Beginning. Class limit: 20 students. **All students pay \$15 course fee.**

COMMUNICATION FOR CHILD CARE PROFESSIONALS

This course is designed to be an introduction to the basic concepts of developing strong communication skills when working in a child care center. Designed around communication issues dealt with in a typical child care day, topics will include communicating positively with families, proper written documentation techniques as well as ideas for working professionally with other staff and the surrounding community. Core of Knowledge: Child Development - Beginning. Class limit: 20 students. **Tuition: In-county \$15, Out-of-county \$20, Out-of-State \$25. All students pay \$35 course fee.**
