Agreement

Whereas Chesapeake College and Salisbury University are committed to expanding educational opportunities, and

Whereas the two institutions are committed to providing a smooth transition for students wishing to earn an associate's degree and a baccalaureate degree, and

Whereas the intent of the institutions is to avoid duplication of curricula where appropriate within articulated programs of study, and

Whereas the institutions better serve the educational growth of students and the economic development of the community through cooperative educational planning and optimal utilization of community resources,

BE IT HEREWITH RESOLVED that this agreement commits the partners to full support of an articulation process to deliver and Associate-Baccalaureate Program in Interdisciplinary Studies, Gender and Sexualities Studies.

PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

1. This program articulation agreement applies to Chesapeake College's Associate of Arts Degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences and Salisbury University's Bachelor of Arts Degree Program in Interdisciplinary Studies, Gender and Sexualities Studies Track.
2. The institutions agree to follow the Connected Degree Curriculum Analysis and Suggested Course Sequence (Attachment A). For additional information, please see Salisbury University's Checklist for Interdisciplinary Studies: Gender and Sexuality Studies Track (Attachment B).
3. Both educational institutions will cooperate toward developing, disseminating, and presenting the articulated program information to students.
4. Graduates of the Chesapeake College program who have completed the associate's degree program in Liberal Arts and Sciences with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher will automatically be granted admission to Salisbury University as an Interdisciplinary Studies major.
5. All articulated course credits earned with a C or better will be accepted for transfer according to the program matrix.
6. Students intending to transfer should apply for admission by the priority deadline for the semester for which they intend to enroll.
7. Students are subject to all the policies and procedures of all institutions.
8. Students are subject to all specific policies pertaining to students admitted to the Baccalaureate Degree Program in Interdisciplinary Studies.
9. This articulation agreement is based on the present curricula contained in this document, and it is effective for a five year period from 2017 to 2022.
10. Either institution may at any time indicate changes to this articulation agreement. Both institutions reserve the right to modify the programs as deemed necessary and agree to inform the appropriate individuals of said changes.

UNIVERSITY POLICIES

- Refer to the SU catalog for approved prerequisites and General Education courses.
- Requirements may not equal 120 credit hours. Students must register for additional electives to complete 120 credits required for graduation.
- All graduates must have a minimum of 30 credits of 300/400-level courses with C grade or above; at least 15 of those credits must be taken at SU.
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for graduation.
- Students must complete at least 30 credit hours by direct classroom instruction and/or laboratory experience.
- Students must take 30 of the last 37 credit hours at SU.
- It is the student's responsibility to satisfy graduation requirements. Please refer to the SU catalog for detailed major requirements.
- Students must apply online for graduation by November 15 for May and by May 15 for December.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

- Complete 9 courses in at least 4 disciplines with grades of C or better.
- A maximum of 15 hours of upper-level transfer credits may be accepted toward the interdisciplinary studies major.
- Demonstrate 102-level proficiency in a foreign language.
