DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- Junior or Senior in high school **and**
- 2.5 or higher cumulative GPA **and**
- Be enrolled in one of the public or private high schools or home school programs in the College's service region **and**
- Be certified by a counselor or school official as meeting all of the eligibility requirements outlined above. Please check with your school for requirements.
- Chesapeake College allows college-ready students to take more than two classes per semester with approval from high school designee.
- College courses may contain controversial issues or topics not covered in a high school class. Dual Enrollment students are expected to participate in these college-level discussions.

Notes: High school students may enroll in summer session courses. Public high school student tuition will not be covered by the Board of Education in the Summer term. Home school students may be eligible for a 25% tuition discount in Fall/Winter/ Spring. Contact the Admissions Office for details.

TO BE VERIFIED AND SIGNED OFF BY COUNSELOR

- Cumulative GPA must be 2.5 or higher
- Dual Enrollment students with a cumulative 3.0 overall high school GPA are eligible to take college English.
- Dual Enrollment students who have both a cumulative GPA of 3.0 **AND** have successfully completed Algebra II with a grade of "C" or better, within the past three years, are eligible for direct placement into college-level math and all college courses that require a college-ready math prerequisite.

PAYMENT OF TUITION, FEES AND BOOKS

- County Boards of Education will be responsible for all applicable fees as well as textbooks and associated costs for public school students. Tuition will be charged to the local boards of education up to individual limits outlined in state law at a rate of 75% of the regular in-county tuition rate. Tuition and course fees for developmental courses are not discounted.
- Students are responsible for purchasing any materials needed for their class; this includes textbooks.
- Public high school students: for reimbursement, books must be purchased or rented at the Chesapeake College Bookstore.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Logging in to MyCampus (the student portal) and setting up your SKIPJACK MAIL to access it on a regular basis.**
- **WATCH** for instructions from the college regarding classes, cancellations etc.
- **NAVIGATE** & learn the entire student portal: Canvas, Self Service, etc.
- **CONFIRM** your final schedule with your high school counselor before classes begin.
- **COMMUNICATE** with Chesapeake Admissions or Dual Enrollment staff **any changes** you need to make, such as dropping or adding classes. Your high school counselor does not have the authority to drop or add your courses at the College. The student must always do this in addition to communicating with their high school counselor.
- **ORDER** books required for your class. These instructions will be sent via SKIPJACK EMAIL.
- **UNDERSTAND** college classes and grades will be on your high school transcript AND permanent college record.
- **COMMIT** yourself to working at an academic college level for a successful college experience.
