



Chesapeake College Student Right to Know Athlete Report 2025

Federal Student Right-to-Know regulations call for colleges and universities to report certain information about the characteristics of their students, including student-athletes who receive athletically-related student aid.

Chesapeake College, a two-year public regional community college serving residents of five counties of Maryland's Upper Eastern Shore, offers a wide array of transfer and career programs and several extracurricular activities, including sponsorship of several intercollegiate sports. The College is classified as a "small" community college with a 2024 fall enrollment of 2,095 students, 20% of whom were full-time and 80% part-time. The College has an open admissions policy.

Since the College offers athletically-related student aid, it must, according to Student Right-to-Know regulations, provide a report on enrollment, graduation, and transfer-out rates. This report includes graduation rates for student-athletes, broken down by gender, race/ethnicity, and sport. However, if a category of students contains five or fewer students, the institution (according to the federal regulations) need not disclose information in that category (in order not to personally identify individuals). In such cases the cell contains "NR" (Not Reported). Because of Chesapeake's small size, it is often the case there are five or fewer students in a category. The numbers for athletes represent only athletes receiving scholarship aid.

Graduation and transfer-out rates are based on degree completion or transfer of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students within "150% of normal time," which for a two-year degree would be three years. The rates do not include those who may have taken longer than three years to graduate or transfer. Please keep in mind that due to the small number of athletes in some categories, percentages shown may be based on only a few students. For groups in which there are no students in the freshman cohort, or no athletes receiving scholarships, the cell is marked with "-".
